Online Training: Successful Business Basics - Are you interested?

Rural Action Centres have recently piloted an online version of the popular business skills course – **Successful Business Basics**. The course covers budgeting, cash flow, tax responsibility, financial statements and beginner Excel. It is delivered via Zoom during eight 1.5 hour sessions (twice per week for 4 weeks).

If there is sufficient demand, we will offer the course again in the very near future. There are already people waiting for the next course; the sooner we know there is enough demand, the sooner we will offer it again. Please note, the course will also be offered in French as well.
